#### child How can vou help your with reading?

When children are young, they love to listen to stories. They focus entirely on the meaning of the book and use books as passports into magic worlds. When they go to school it sometimes seems that their reading turns into a struggle to read words and they may lose their focus on meaning. We must always help them to see that it is the meaning that matters, words are just a means to an end. If children are thinking about meaning they can guess a word or two here and there and not lose meaning. Good readers often do this. It doesn't matter what children read, as long as they are reading and enjoying it!

There is a Developmental Continuum for Reading and this term we will be providing suggestions with how you can help your child with reading at home, following this progression of learning. You will already be doing many of these things, but you might find one or two new ideas that would be fun to try.

#### PHASE 1: ROLE PLAY READING

- encourage your child to choose the books you read together and help the child to tell the story from pictures in the book
- talk about the books you read and the people, things and animals in them
- select books that describe familiar experiences, concepts and objects as well as fairy tales and fantasy stories
- make use of quality "book and tape" sets during busy times in the daily schedule
- hold the book so the child can see the pictures and writing
- help your child to tell the story from the pictures in the book

## PHASE 2: EXPERIMENTAL READING

- read to your child whenever you can. Now and again ask a few 'why' questions about the story as you read
- compare events and people in books with your own lives
- let your child "read" to you and to anyone who is willing to listen e.g. grandparents, neighbours, even the cat!
- leave plenty of scrap paper, pencils and crayons on the child's table or desk. Give him/her old diaries or inexpensive notebooks
- encourage your child to find words that begin with the same letter as his/her name
- encourage your child to look at the title and cover of a book and guess what it may be about

It work by using eleven different projectors and Laser lights to make a 3-D image. Alon, a Some movies today they are not using real animals to entertain people.


The Daly Circus who had Storley doing a holographic Circus is Circus Rancalli. Using holographs is noy better than Using real like animals.
