Kindergarten 2022 enrolments

We are now accepting enrolments for Kindergarten 2022.

If you have not submitted an enrolment form please do so online via our school website or collect an enrolment at the school office.

The online enrolment process is being used by more than 2000 schools across NSW and only supports applications to both **your local school as well as 'out of area' enrolments.** To visit our online enrolment application please go to our school website and then click on the enrolment tab up the very top of the page.

To find your local school visit school finder.

How it works

- The parent or carer completing the application must provide the child's main residential address and a contact email to begin the online enrolment process.
- A one-time security code will be sent to this email to authenticate the parent against their email, then the online enrolment form can be completed, and the parent can use this email address to resume at a later time.
- The dynamic form will only show the mandatory fields in relation to the specific student, which means parents will only be required to complete the fields of the application relevant to circumstances of their child.
- The form can take as little as 10 minutes to complete and is sent directly to the school administration staff of your local school.
- Parents will be emailed a PDF copy of the enrolment application immediately

following the submission for their own records.

- School administration staff can then contact parents directly for any clarification required around the application.
- The application to enrol will be finalised once the parent/carer has met with the school and provided all the relevant identity and medical documentation for the student.



Kindergarten 2022 - JUMPSTART

Granville South Schools as Community Centres Project is offering the opportunity for you and your child to participate in a program to help prepare for starting school in 2022.

Children will develop:

- Social skills
- Fine Motor Skills developing those small muscles - so important to ensure children are successful writers
- Early Literacy Skills developing a love of reading; exploring speaking and listening; transferring words to meaning

- Gross Motor Skills the big muscles needed to run and move and play
- Build confidence
- Experience school routines

These sessions will only be open to children starting school in 2022. Younger siblings are <u>not</u> able to attend the 'Jump Start' program, but FREE Child minding will be available for them or you can make your own arrangements for these younger ones.

This program is for parent and child. It will be a great opportunity for you to engage with your child as they learn and will also help you to understand how to help your child.

The JUMP START program will run for 6 weeks – each Tuesday from 3rd August until 7th September. This program is open to all children who will be starting Kindergarten in 2022 but will be of particular benefit to children who have not attended Pre School.

Would you like to improve your First Aid skills?

Kidsaver Baby & Child CPR + First Aid Workshop- 3 hours.

This class is aimed at parents to help them feel able to assist with their children and family in an emergency. In this workshop we cover a variety of topics including:

- How to act quickly and calmly in an emergency
- · Paediatric red flags / when to worry
- Baby & child CPR
- Prevention / management of choking

Additionally, this class covers how to manage the most common first aid emergencies for babies and children including burns, falls & head injuries, drowning, poisons, bites & stings, temperatures, febrile convulsions, seizures, anaphylaxis, allergies and more. This is NOT a Certificate course - there will not be an exam and it will not earn a Nationally recognised qualification

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Student Wellbeing

Granville South PS has been successfully using the Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) to support student wellbeing. The BSEM is a practical approach to teaching and learning that enables teachers to increase engagement with students to successfully improve all students' self-regulation, growth and academic achievement. The strategies incorporate evidence-based trauma-aware teaching, positive education, and wellbeing practices. One of the strategies used focuses on de-escalation, meaning a way to calm. These are really great ways to help your child calm when they are feeling upset. They are great strategies for adults too!
