NAPLAN

NAPLAN is once again being held this week. All students in Years 3 & 5 will be sitting four tests across the next three or four days. The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.



Excursions

Your child may have already received a note regarding a school excursion. Excursions are a great way to complement the learning that happens in the classroom. It is expected that all students attend.

There are many benefits of School Excursions. They include:

- They help reinforce what has been taught in the classroom Students may get to learn in a new environment with new teachers or instructors.
- Students are excited and energised by the anticipation of leaving the classroom and school environment. Fun school excursions will help students retain the information they have learnt on their trip.
- Exposure to new experiences outside the classroom students have the opportunity of being exposed to new experiences and observe new things that are not available at school, such as wildlife, different cultures and tours/visits to iconic buildings and areas.
- Social skills getting out of the classroom gives children an opportunity to spend time with each other in a new environment without the structure of the classroom. School excursions often require students to spend time in small groups, observing, chatting and learning.

Stage 3 Camp

After two years, we are finally happy to bring our Stage 3 camp. Students have the opportunity to attend a two-night camp at our Aussie Bush Camp at Kincumber. School camp is a place where memories are made. The benefits of school camp are as follows:
